Question: What has Ireland learned from Origin Green that would be helpful for NZ farmers?	North Island - Session A
Answer:	
This is Ireland's food and drink sustainability programme. Led by An Bord Bia [The Irish Food Board] the motivation behind the programme is to assist the Irish Food Industry produce food in the most sustainable way. Working across all levels of the supply chain, the programme enables Ireland's farmers, manufacturers, retail and food service operators to set – and achieve -measurable sustainability targets that protect the environment and serve local communities more effectively.	
At present 319 member companies have been independently verified and have annually measured sustainability plans. These plans have to be for a minimum period of 3 years initially. Companies are required to set 7 targets in each of 3 key areas:	
Raw material sourcing	
Manufacturing processes	
And social sustainability	
The sustainability plan will be verified annually by an independent auditor called Mabbett [which has developed a strong capability in this area]. A further 282 companies are now developing sustainability plans. The old adage applies if you can't measure it then you can't manage it. Now these 601 companies will be	
yearly setting stretch targets in these areas. A strong improvement yearly has been the outcome. An Bord Bia will advise all companies initially as to how to structure ambitious but achievable sustainability targets. Is it making a difference?

The majority of participating firms now say they have a much better understanding of what sustainability is and how to improve In this area. Their cultures have been improved internally while externally consumers and supermarkets have been very favourably impressed with such a proactive approach. Bord Bia believe that over time huge further improvement is both necessary and will happen The strong belief is that this collaborative approach is working really well.
