GROWING  
DAIRY'S  
FUTURE

Last year's successful NZ Pasture Summit Conference is being followed up with two field days, hosted by farmers for farmers with technical input from dairy sector specialists, sharing ideas and developments on achieving profitable food production from grass.

Attendees will have the opportunity to look inside the farm gate of two of the farmer speakers from the 2018 Pasture Summit Conference (Pete Morgan and Greg Roadley). It's an opportunity to find out what makes these two dairy businesses consistently and robustly profitable with topics including:

- An overview of each farm and its business financials.
- An examination of where each farm sits on costs and profit relative to other farms in the region.
- A farm walk to view and discuss pasture, the herd and how to adapt and thrive through the next decade.
- Optional after lunch session looking at live examples of the pathways for equity growth (e.g. a new farm purchase joint venture, a farm equity sharing partnership, and a herd owning sharemilking start-up).
